AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE OWNERS OF CERTAIN PARCELS OF LAND TO RESIDE IN MOBILE HOMES ON SAID PARCELS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The fifth paragraph of section 3 of chapter 40A of the General  
2 Laws, as inserted by chapter 860 of the acts of 1977, is hereby  
3 amended by inserting in line 1 after the word "prohibit" the  
4 words: — the owner of a lot who is building a residence on said lot  
5 which will be occupied by him or.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION ACT TO READ IN PART AS FOLLOWS:

Section 5 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, as amended, shall read as follows:

The first paragraph of section 5 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, as amended, shall read as follows: "In any proceeding brought by or on behalf of the Commission under this section, the Commission may, in its discretion, require the defendant to produce to the Commission any books, papers, documents, contracts, correspondence, or other records or communications, or any copies thereof, which are in the possession, custody, or control of the defendant, and which are relevant to the proceeding." The word "proceeding" shall mean any proceeding brought by or on behalf of the Commission under this section.
