AN ACT AMENDING THE LAW TRANSFERRING CERTAIN BIRTH, MARRIAGE AND DEATH RECORDS TO THE STATE SECRETARY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 4 of Chapter 374 of the Acts of 1983 is hereby amended
- 2 by adding the following at the end of said section:
- 3 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,
- 4 said copies of vital records books subsequently transferred to the
- 5 State Secretary and all original records of birth, marriage and
- 6 death, corresponding to these copies, which are on file in the office
- 7 of city and town clerks, shall be maintained as public records in
- 8 accordance with Chapter 66 of the General Laws upon transfer of
- 9 said copies to the office of the State Secretary.
