AN ACT PERTAINING TO THE RIGHTS OF CANCER PATIENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 70E of chapter III of the General Laws, as most recently
2 amended by chapter 720 of the acts of 1979 is hereby further
3 amended by striking out, in the sixth paragraph of said section,
4 clause (h) and inserting in place thereof the following new clause: —
5 (h) In the case of a patient suffering from any form of cancer, to
6 complete information on all forms of recommended and alternative
7 treatments and potential adverse effects of such treatments. Said
8 information shall be in written form using simple, non-technical
9 language and including notice that the patient should consider
10 seeking a second opinion regarding diagnosis and treatment. The
11 patient shall be provided written notification of groups in the area
12 that are available to provide total support and information regard-
13 ing the patient's illness.
