In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Six.

AN ACT REGULATING THE AVAILABILITY OF VOTING LISTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section six of chapter fifty-one as most recently
2 amended by section one of chapter two hundred and twenty-two of
3 the acts of nineteen eighty-two is hereby further amended by add-
4 ing the following: —

5 Any street list requested under the provisions of this section
6 shall be made available to the person or organization making such
7 a request, within five working days of said request.

1 SECTION 2. Section fifty-five of said chapter as most recently
2 amended by section one of chapter three hundred and ten of the
3 acts of nineteen hundred and seventy-six is hereby further amend-
4 ed by adding the following: —

5 The supplementary voting lists so called, of the names added
6 thereto or taken therefrom as persons are found to be qualified or
7 not qualified to vote shall be printed and available on the first of
8 each month following July 1, provided, however, that the final
9 supplementary voting list prepared after the close of registration
10 shall be printed and available no later than the fifteenth day
11 preceding a state primary or election and in the case of a municipi-
12 pal election no later than the twelfth day preceding a preliminary
13 or final election.

14 Any list requested under this section shall be provided to the
15 person making the request within five working days of said
16 request.

By the Committee on Finance, for their Report, together with the report of the Finance Committee on the bill to amend the act to provide for the payment of the interest on the public debt, and for other purposes, passed July 1, 1892.

REPORT

OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, ON THE BILL TO AMEND THE ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE INTEREST ON THE PUBLIC DEBT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES, PASSED JULY 1, 1892.

THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, in compliance with a resolution of the Senate, passed July 1, 1892, have the honor to report the following bill to amend the act to provide for the payment of the interest on the public debt, and for other purposes, passed July 1, 1892, and to recommend that the bill be passed with amendments.

SECTION 1. That the act to provide for the payment of the interest on the public debt, and for other purposes, passed July 1, 1892, be amended so that the interest on the public debt shall be paid in gold coin of the United States.

SECTION 2. SECTION 3. That the act to provide for the payment of the interest on the public debt, and for other purposes, passed July 1, 1892, be amended so that the interest on the public debt shall be paid in gold coin of the United States, and that the Secretary of the Treasury be authorized to issue such bonds as may be necessary to provide for the payment of the interest on the public debt.
