By Mr. Speliotis of Danvers, petition of Theodore C. Speliotis for legislation to further regulate the transportation of alcohol. Government Regulations.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE TRANSPORTATION OF ALCOHOL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 22 of Chapter 138 of the General Laws as
2 most recently amended by Chapter 261 of the Acts of 1983 is
3 hereby further amended in the first sentence of the first paragraph
4 by striking the words "eight gallons of malt beverage" and inserting
5 in place the words "five gallons of malt beverage."

1 SECTION 2. The last paragraph of said section is hereby
2 amended by inserting at the end the following: —

3 "Any vehicle engaged in transporting any alcoholic beverage or
4 alcohol except as authorized by this section may be impounded at
5 the owner's expense by the investigating law enforcement official."
