AN ACT PLACING EMPLOYEES OF MUNICIPAL GAS AND ELECTRIC PLANTS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE "HEART LAW", SO-CALLED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 94 of chapter 32 of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in chapter 610 of the acts of 1963, is hereby
3 amended by inserting after the word "duty", in line 11, the
4 words: —, or to any employee of a municipal gas or electric plant
5 who is employed as a lineman, electric switchboard operator,
6 electric maintenance man, steam engineer, boiler operator, fireman,
7 oiler, mechanical maintenance man and supervisors of said
8 employees.
