The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Six.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF CERTAIN PUBLIC HIGHER EDUCATION EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 3(g) of Chapter 32 of the Massachusetts General Laws is
2 hereby amended by adding the following new language:

3 Group 2. Public works building police, permanent watershed
4 guards and permanent park police; University of Massachusetts
5 police; employees of the Massachusetts Port Authority, comprising
6 guards, guard sergeants, head guard and chief of waterfront police,
7 officials and employees of the department of public safety having
8 police powers; employees of a municipal department who are
9 employed as fire or police signal operators or signal maintenance
10 repairmen; ambulance attendants of a municipal department who
11 are required to respond to fires and perform duties assigned to
12 them; employees of a city or town who are employed as licensed
13 electricians and elevator maintenance men employed by a county;
14 employees of the Commonwealth or any county, regardless of any
15 official classification, except sheriff, superintendent, assistant dep-
16 uty superintendent and correction officers of county correctional
17 facilities, whose regular and major duties require them to have the
18 care, custody, instruction or other supervision of prisoners; and
19 employees of the Commonwealth or of any county whose regular
20 and major duties require them to have the care, custody, instruction
21 or other supervision of parolees or persons who are mentally ill or
22 mentally defective or defective delinquents or wayward children

23 and employees of Cushing Hospital; and all electricians and eleva-
 24 tor repairmen employed at public higher education institutions;
 25 provided, that no member who attains age sixty-five while classified
 26 in Group 1 may thereafter be classified in Group 2, irrespective of
 27 change of employment.
