AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING PROVISIONAL APPOINTMENTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section thirteen of chapter 31 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding the following paragraph: —

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in order to develop  
4 and maintain career ladders, whenever there are three or more  
5 persons certified in the next lower title for at least one year, the  
6 appointing authority, prior to making a request for a provisional  
7 appointment, shall request a promotional examination.
