The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Six.

AN ACT TO FURTHER REGULATE THE FEES OF COURT STENOGRAPHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 88 of Chapter 221 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in Section 254 of the Acts of 1978, is hereby amended
3 by striking out the first sentence and substituting in place there-
4 of: — “Upon request of the presiding justice or any party, the
5 stenographer shall furnish a transcript of his notes or any part
6 thereof, taken at a trial or hearing, for which he shall be paid by the
7 party requesting it at the rate of 95 cents a hundred words for one
8 copy only, and if more than one copy is requested or ordered at the
9 same time, at the rate of 90 cents a hundred words and 40 cents a
10 hundred words for each additional copy.”

1 SECTION 2. Further amendment of said Section of said Chap-
2 ter so appearing in Section 254 in the Acts of 1978 is hereby
3 amended by striking out the second sentence and inserting in place
4 thereof: — “In the event that daily copy is ordered by the presiding
5 justice or any party, the rate of an original copy only shall be \$1
6 dollar a hundred words and if more than one copy is requested at
7 the same time, at the rate of 95 cents a hundred words and 50 cents
8 a hundred words for each additional copy.”
