AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING LICENSING OF CERTAIN PROFESSIONS AND OCCUPATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding chapter one hundred and twelve or any gen-
2 eral law to the contrary, failure to renew a license or certificate
3 of registration prior to the expiration of such license or certificate
4 shall result in the imposition of a late fee equal to the amount
5 of the state renewal fee. The director of registration shall prom-
6 ulgate rules and regulations to establish policies and procedures
7 for late fee collection.
