AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF DUKES COUNTY TO BORROW MONEY FOR A TRUCK, PHOTO COPIER AND OFFICE EQUIPMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Dukes county are
2 hereby authorized to spend such sums as may be necessary, not
3 exceeding, in the aggregate, thirty thousand dollars to purchase
4 a truck, photo copier and office equipment.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes authorized in section one, the
2 treasurer of said county, with the approval of the county
3 commissioners and with the approval of the Dukes county
4 advisory board, may borrow upon the credit of the county such
5 sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggregate, thirty
6 thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or notes of the county
7 therefor which bear on their face the words Dukes County Loan,
8 Act of 1985. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate loan
9 and such loans shall be payable not more than five years from
10 their dates. The bonds or notes shall be signed by the county
11 treasurer and countersigned by a majority of the county
12 commissioners. The county may sell said securities at public or
13 private sale, upon such terms and conditions as the county
14 commissioners may deem proper, but not for less than their par
15 value. Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall, except as herein
16 provided, be subject to chapter thirty-five of the General Laws.
