AN ACT REQUIRING THE USE OF HEADLIGHTS ON MOTOR VEHICLES IN POOR WEATHER CONDITIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 89 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
- 2 after section 4C the following section: —
- 3 Section 4D. Whenever weather conditions obscure or obstruct
- 4 the visibility of operators of motor vehicles, said operators shall
- 5 activate the headlights thereof.
