AN ACT REQUIRING THAT DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS OF CREDIT UNIONS BE ELECTED BY SHAREHOLDERS BY MARKED BALLOT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 14 of chapter 171 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 1984 Official Edition is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out the second sentence and inserting in place thereof the
4 following sentence: — The directors shall be elected by the share-
5 holders by ballot mailed to each shareholders.

1 SECTION 2. Section 15 of chapter 171 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following
4 sentence: —

5 A President, Treasurer, and such Vice-presidents assistant treas-
6 urers, and as the directors may designate shall be elected by the
7 shareholders by ballot mailed to each shareholder.
