AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE COMMISSIONER OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHING OF A CURRICULUM PROGRAM CONCERNING CITIZENSHIP AND CHARACTER REDEVELOPMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The commissioner of the board of education is hereby author-
2 ized and directed to promulgate rules and regulations relative to
3 the establishment and administration of a curriculum program
4 concerning citizenship and character development. Such program
5 shall include, but not be limited to, instruction in value of honesty,
6 self-reliance, self-discipline, perseverance, tolerance for all races,
7 religions and ethnic groups, and respect for the property and rights
8 of other people. Such program shall be administered for no more
9 than two years in no more than ten public school systems as
10 determined by said commissioner upon application of the school
11 committee of any such public school system.

12 Such funds shall be expended on this program as may be appro-
13 priated therefor.
