AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the
2 state retirement board is hereby authorized and directed to grant
3 creditable service to any employee of the board of regents for the
4 period said employee was compensated subsequent to March first,
5 nineteen hundred and eighty-one by said board of regents under
6 a subsidiary "03" account; provided that said employee had been
7 a member of the contributory retirement system prior to said
8 March first, nineteen hundred and eighty-one, and provided
9 further that said employee was, subsequent to said service under
10 said "03" account, compensated by said board under a subsidiary
11 "01" or "02" account, as a member of the contributory retirement
12 system. Such creditable service shall be granted only upon
13 payment by said employees into the annuity savings fund of the
14 state retirement system such amount together with interest
15 thereon as said state retirement board may determine as being
16 equal to that which such employee would have paid into such
17 funds if said employee were a member in service, in accordance
18 with the provisions of chapter 32 of the General Laws, during said
19 period. This law shall not apply to employees whom were hired
20 by the board of regents on or after October thirty-first, nineteen
21 hundred and eighty-two.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1, Clause 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State. No Representative shall be chosen for a Term longer than two Years; but he may be re-elected. Members shall have the Privileges and Immunities of Senators. No Person shall be Representative of this State unless he shall, when elected, have seven Years Residence in this State, and for the first Year after he shall have been elected, he shall, in addition to the foregoing, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and three Years a Citizen of this State. The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State. The House of Representatives shall choose their Speaker and other Officers; and they shall meet in the City of New York, until otherwise ordered by Law. The House of Representatives may, by a two thirds Majority, remove from Office any Judge, Justice, or Officer of the United States, who shall be convicted of Treason, Bribery, or other high Crimes and Misdemeanors. The House of Representatives shall be the sole Judge of the Elections, Returns, and Qualifications of its Members. The House of Representatives may adjourn from Day to Day, and may, by a majority, adjourn to any other Place within the United States. The House of Representatives may, by a majority, suspend any Member for Disorderly Behaviour, and may, by a two thirds Majority, expel a Member. The House of Representatives may, by a majority, impeach and try any Judge, Justice, or Officer of the United States, who shall be convicted of Treason, Bribery, or other high Crimes and Misdemeanors.
