Flood that cities and towns be reimbursed by the Commonwealth for costs associated with resource recovery facilities, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 567) of Mary Jeanette Murray relative to authorizing county commissioners and the Department of Environmental Quality Engineering to establish, operate, maintain and control facilities for energy resource recovery and for the collection, transfer, processing and disposal of solid waste, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2274) of Peter Forman relative to the protection of water resources, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2485) of Roger R. Goyette and William Constantino, Jr., relative to reviving and continuing the special commission established to make an investigation and study relative to hazardous and solid wastes and the transportation of hazardous materials, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2493) of Roger R. Goyette that the Attorney General be required to notify municipalities of the penalties for illegal dumping of hazardous wastes, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2494) of Roger R. Goyette that the Department of Environmental Management be directed to establish hazardous waste transfer stations, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2500) of Roger R. Goyette for legislation to require that certain generators of hazardous waste be licensed by the Department of Environmental Quality Engineering, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2503) of Roger R. Goyette that the Department of Environmental Management be directed to establish one hazardous waste disposal containment site in the Commonwealth; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2823) of Joseph K. Mackey relative to refuse treatment and disposal facilities, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3784) of

Angelo M. Scaccia for legislation to further regulate the labelling of certain hazardous substances, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4338) of Roger R. Goyette for legislation to create the Massachusetts integrated solid and hazardous waste department, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4341) of William P. Nagle, Jr., relative to the removal and transportation of garbage, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4344) of William P. Nagle, Jr., for legislation to control the disposal of waste substances and washwater resulting from the cleaning of bulk truck tankers, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4346) of William P. Nagle, Jr., for legislation to regulate the hours of operation of vehicles transporting garbage or other offensive materials, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4347) of William P. Nagle, Jr., that local boards of health be required to make rules and regulations for control of the removal, transportation or disposal of garbage, offal or other offensive substances, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4479) of Roger R. Goyette for legislation to establish a fund for the cleanup of underground gasoline leaks, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4480) of Peter G. Torkildsen that the Department of Environmental Quality Engineering be required to notify local fire chiefs of the existence of certain hazardous or toxic substances within the jurisdiction of such fire chiefs, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4634) of William Constantino, Jr., that cities and towns be reimbursed by the Commonwealth for expenses incurred in the operation of municipal landfills, reports recommending that the accompanying resolve (House, No. 5693) ought to pass.

RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ON SOLID AND HAZARDOUS WASTE.

1 *Resolved*, that the special commission established by chapter
2 704 of the acts of 1979 shall, in the course of its investigation and
3 study, consider the subject matter of the current senate document
4 numbered 1127, legislation to facilitate the disposal of solid waste;
5 and the current house documents numbered 567, legislation to
6 authorize county commissioners and DEQE to establish, operate,
7 maintain and control facilities for energy resource recovery and
8 for the collection, transfer, processing and disposal of solid wastes;
9 2274, resolve expanding the membership of the special
10 commission established to make an investigation and study
11 relative to hazardous and solid wastes and hazardous material
12 transportation; 2493, for legislation to require the attorney general
13 of the commonwealth to notify municipalities within the
14 commonwealth of penalties for illegal dumping of hazardous
15 waste; 2494, for legislation to establish one or more transfer
16 station sites in the commonwealth of massachusetts; 2500, for
17 legislation licensing certain generators of hazardous waste; 2503;
18 for legislation to establish one hazardous waste disposal
19 containment site in massachusetts; 2823, for legislation relative
20 to refuse treatment and disposal facilities; 4338, for legisla-
21 tion creating the massachusetts integrated hazardous waste
22 department; 4341, for legislation relative to permits for the
23 removal and transportation of garbage, etc; 4344, for legislation
24 controlling the disposal of waste substances and washwater
25 resulting from the cleaning of bulk truck tankers; 4346, for
26 legislation relative to restrictions on the hours of operations for
27 refuse vehicles; 4347, for legislation relative to rules and
28 regulations for removal, etc., of garbage, etc; 4634, for legislation
29 providing for state reimbursement to cities and towns for expenses
30 incurred in complying with certain laws and regulations relative
31 to the operation of municipal landfills; 566, for legislation

32 providing for reimbursement for costs associated with resource
33 recovery facilities; 2485, resolve expanding the membership of the
34 special commission established to make an investigation and study
35 relative to hazardous and solid wastes and hazardous material
36 transportation; 4479, for legislation establishing a fund for
37 underground leaks, and 3784, for legislation to further regulate
38 the labelling of certain hazardous substances; and 4480, legislation
39 requiring DEQE to notify local fire chiefs of the existence of
40 certain hazardous or toxic substances within the jurisdiction of
41 such fire chiefs.
