RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY AN ADVISORY BOARD ON LEGISLATIVE, JUDICIAL AND CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICERS' COMPENSATION.

1 *Resolved*, That the advisory board on legislative, judicial, and
2 constitutional officers' compensation, established under section
3 one hundred and sixty-two of Chapter six of the General Laws
4 shall, in the course of its investigation and study, consider the
5 subject matter of current House documents numbered 1003, rela-
6 tive to authorizing the payment of accumulated sick and vacation
7 leave to retiring justices of the trial court, 1374, relative to includ-
8 ing assistant clerks of courts as members of the advisory committee
9 on personnel standards within the Trial Court, 1564, relative to the
10 salary of technical assistants for registers of deeds in the common-
11 wealth, 1704, relative to judicial expenses and compensation, 1706,
12 relative to compensating justices for personal injuries, 1708, rela-
13 tive to the leaves of absence of judges and clerk magistrates of the
14 Trial Court, 1709, relative to entitling certain judges with ten years
15 of full-time judicial service leaves of absence, 1710, relative to
16 accumulated vacation time for judicial service, 2692, relative to
17 sick leave and vacation time for certain judges of the Trial Court,
18 2693, relative to the judicial leaves of absence, 2696, relative to
19 leaves of absence of judges of the Trial Court, 2705, relative to
20 authorizing the district attorney of the Suffolk District to continue
21 to employ police officers of the police department of the city of
