1     *Ordered*, That the committee on Election Laws be authorized to  
2 sit during the session and recess of the General Court for the  
3 purpose of making investigation and study of the process by which  
4 election day workers are chosen in the Commonwealth, including  
5 the current Senate document numbered 337 and current House  
6 document numbered 1291.

7     Said committee shall report the results of its investigation and  
8 study, and its recommendations, if any, to the General Court,  
9 together with the drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
10 recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of  
11 the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday in  
12 December, nineteen hundred and eighty-six.
