The committee on the Judiciary, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 350) of Mary Jeanette Murray relative to permitting certain employers to gain access to criminal history records of certain employees who work with children, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 755) of Bruce N. Freeman relative to permitting certain employers to gain access to criminal history records of certain employees who work with children, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 760) of Roger R. Goyette for legislation to allow certain schools and businesses to have access to criminal history records of prospective employees, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4161) of Iris K. Holland relative to providing certain employers with access to criminal history records of employees who work with children, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5292) of William G. Robinson and other members of the House relative to providing certain employers with access to criminal history records of certain employees who work with children, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5952) ought to be adopted.

1     *Ordered*, That the committee on the Judiciary be authorized  
2 to sit during the session and during the recess of the General Court  
3 for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject  
4 matter of certain House documents relative to criminal records.  
5     Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State  
6 House or elsewhere, may hold hearings, may travel within the  
7 Commonwealth, and may expend for clerical and other services  
8 such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said Committee shall  
9 report to the General Court the results of its investigation and  
10 study and its recommendations, if any, together with the drafts  
11 of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect  
12 by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives  
13 on or before the last Wednesday in December, nineteen hundred  
14 and eighty-six.
