RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION
RELATIVE TO THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That the special commission established by Chapter
2 10 of the resolves of 1979, and most recently revived and continued
3 by Chapter 1 of the resolves of 1985, shall, in the course of its
4 investigation and study, consider the subject matter of current
5 Senate document 1635, authorizing Leo F. Grace to take a civil
6 service examination for police officer notwithstanding the
7 maximum age requirements, and current House documents 1175,
8 providing for an interchange of employees, and 6026, relative to
9 the appointment of permanent conservation skilled helpers at the
10 division of marine fisheries publication plant in Newburyport.
