AN ACT ALLOWING FOR THE USE OF CREDIT CARDS IN PAYING CERTAIN MOTOR VEHICLE FINES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 20A of chapter 90 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 inserting in line 69 after the word "clerk" the following words: —
4 provided, however, in any city or town of twenty thousand or
5 more inhabitants said clerk may accept payment by use of credit
6 card.

1 SECTION 2. Section 20A½ of chapter 90 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 inserting in line 51 after the word "clerk" the following words: —
4 provided, however, in any city or town of twenty thousand or
5 more inhabitants said clerk may accept payment by use of credit
6 card.

1 SECTION 3. Any parking clerk of a city or town of twenty
2 thousand or more inhabitants who wishes to accept payments
3 under the provisions of section one or two of this act shall first
4 negotiate a discount rate with the banking institution responsible
5 for the issuance of any credit card so acceptable.
