AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE AVAILABILITY OF INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR MOTORIZED BICYCLES AT THE OPTION OF THE INSURED.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The definition of "Motor Vehicle" in section 1
2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended by section 3 of
3 chapter 261 of the acts of 1976, is hereby further amended by
4 striking out the second sentence of said definition and inserting
5 a new sentence: — The definition of "motor vehicles" shall include
6 motorized bicycles.

1 SECTION 2. Section 34A of chapter 90 of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking out the definition of
3 "Motor Vehicles" and inserting in place thereof the following
4 definition: — "Motor Vehicle" shall, in addition to the meaning
5 prescribed by section one, include a trailer, as defined by sec-
6 tion one, but exclude a motorized bicycle, as defined by section
7 one.

1 SECTION 3. The first sentence of the second paragraph of
2 section 113C of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as most
3 recently amended by section 12 of chapter 241 of the acts of
4 1983, is hereby further amended by inserting after the word
5 "option," in line 4, the following words: — coverage for motor-
6 ized bicycles of at least the compulsory motor vehicle liability
7 insurance limits required by section thirty-four A of chapter
8 ninety.
