SENATE No. 855

By Mr. Doane, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 855) of Paul V. Doane for legislation to provide for the appointment of an additional probation officer in the Edgartown Division of the District Court Department of the Trial Court. The Judiciary.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Six.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ADDITIONAL PROBATION OFFICER IN THE EDGARTOWN DIVISION OF THE DISTRICT COURT DEPARTMENT OF THE TRIAL COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 83 of chapter 176 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the third sentence the following
3 sentence: — There shall be appointed in addition to the number of
4 probation officers authorized for the Edgartown division of the
5 district court department another probation officer.

The bill provides a certain number of copies of the bill to be printed for the use of the Senate and the House of Representatives, and also for the use of the several States and Territories.

The Committee of the Senate

In the year 1850 the Senate and House of Representatives passed a bill to amend the act relating to the printing of the laws of the United States. The bill provided that the Senate and House of Representatives should each have a certain number of copies of the laws printed for their use, and also for the use of the several States and Territories. The bill also provided that the Secretary of the Senate should be authorized to purchase the necessary paper and to employ a printer to print the laws.
