**AN ACT RELATIVE TO LICENSES TO OPERATE MOTOR VEHICLES OF PERSONS
SERVING IN THE ARMED FORCES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 23A of Chapter 708 of the Acts of 1941, as most
2 recently amended by Chapter 507 of the Acts of 1955, is hereby
3 further amended by striking out the first paragraph and inserting
4 in place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 Any license to operate motor vehicles issued under section eight
6 of chapter ninety of the General Laws which by its terms has
7 expired or shall expire during the active service of the holder
8 thereof in the armed forces of the United States, shall be renewed
9 without charge by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles; provided
10 however if said license expires and the holder thereof cannot renew
11 said license it shall continue in force as a valid license until the
12 expiration of sixty days after the termination of such service by
13 honorable discharge or release, subject to all other provisions of
14 said chapter ninety relative to such license.
