AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF EMPLOYEES OF THE BOSTON WATER AND SEWER COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Division of law enforcement, office of secretary of the executive
2 office of retirement affairs; officials and employees of the registry
3 of motor vehicles appointed by the registrar under section 29 of
4 chapter 90; capitol police; members of the state police detectives
5 appointed under section 6 of chapter 22, serving in any division of
6 the department of public safety; members of the police force of the
7 metropolitan district commission; employees of the Massachu-
8 setts Port Authority at General Edward Lawrence Logan Interna-
9 tional Airport, comprising permanent crash crewman, fire control
10 men, assistant fire control men; members of police force of the
11 metropolitan district commission; employees of the Massachu-
12 setts Port Authority at General Edward Lawrence Logan Interna-
13 tional Airport, comprising permanent crash crewmen, fire control
14 men, assistant fire control men; members of police and fire
15 departments not classified in Group I; any police officer of the
16 Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority; employees whose
17 regular compensation is paid by the United States from funds
18 allocated to the Massachusetts National Guard and who are regu-
19 larly and permanently employed under the control of the military
20 department of the commonwealth and whose duties in such
21 employment require substantially all normal working hours and
22 whose continued employment is based on federal recognition in

23 the Massachusetts National Guard; employees of a municipal gas
24 or electric generating or distribution plant who are employed as
25 linemen, electric switchboard operators, electric maintenance
26 men, stream engineers, boiler operators, fireman, oilers, mechan-
27 ical maintenance men, and supervisors of said employees; employ-
28 ees of the department of correction who are employed at any
29 correctional institution or prison camp under the control of said
30 department and who hold the position of correction officer, female
31 correction officer, industrial instructor recreation officer, assistant
32 industrial shop manager, industrial shop manager; assistant to the
33 supervisor of industries, supervisor of industries, senior correction
34 officer, senior female correction officer, senior female correction
35 officer, prison camp officer, assistant deputy superintendent, chief
36 of security for the University of Massachusetts medical school or
37 supervising identification agent; employees who hold the position
38 of state hospital steward in the department of correction officers of
39 county correctional facilities; and the chief fire warden and district
40 fire wardens in the executive office of environmental affairs; and
41 all field maintenance and supervisors of the Boston Water and
42 Sewer Commission.
