AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ALDERMAN AND/OR GOVERNING BODY TO DESIGNATE POLLING PLACES IN ADJACENT PRECINCTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The alderman and/or governing body may designate a polling
2 place in an adjacent precinct of such city or town; and provided,
3 secondly, then in a city or town, if no suitable polling place can be
4 had within such precinct or if the selectman and/or appropriate
5 governing body conclude that the public convenience would be
6 better served by such action, they may designate a polling place in
7 another precinct, or may house all polling places in a single build-
8 ing within the city or town.
