

By Mr. Scaccia of Boston, petition of Angelo M. Scaccia that the deputy Commissioner of Capital Planning and Operations be authorized to acquire certain quarry lands in the city of Quincy for reservation purposes. State Administration.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Seven.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPUTY COMMISSIONER OF CAPITAL PLANNING AND OPERATIONS TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN QUINCY QUARRY LANDS FOR RESERVATION PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The deputy commissioner of capital planning and
2 operations is hereby authorized, subject to the provisions of sec-
3 tions 40F $\frac{1}{2}$ and 40H through 40J, inclusive, of chapter seven of the
4 General Laws, to acquire by eminent domain under chapter
5 seventy-nine of the General Laws or to acquire by purchase or
6 otherwise, subject to such additional terms as the deputy commis-
7 sioner may prescribe, in consultation with the Metropolitan Dis-
8 trict Commission, certain real property on any interest therein
9 located in the city of Quincy for reservation purposes deemed by the
10 Metropolitan District Commission, said land containing various
11 quarries and a proposed recreational footpath, containing in the
12 aggregate about one hundred and twenty acres.

13 The deputy commissioner is hereby authorized to expend a sum
14 not exceeding three million five hundred thousand dollars for the
15 acquisition of land and associated costs connected therewith.

1 SECTION 2. No deed conveying by or on behalf of the Com-
2 monwealth the property described in section one or any interest
3 therein and no lease of said property shall be valid unless such deed
4 or lease provides that said property shall be used for the purpose of
5 reservations, conservation and the preservation of open space.

1 SECTION 3. The state treasurer may borrow from time to time
2 on the credit of the commonwealth such sums of money as may be
3 necessary for the purpose of meeting the payments authorized by
4 this act and may issue and renew from time to time notes of the
5 commonwealth therefor, bearing interest payable at such time and
6 at such rates as shall be fixed by the state treasurer. Such notes shall
7 be issued and may be renewed one or more times for such terms, not
8 exceeding one year, as the governor may recommend to the general
9 court in accordance with Section 3 of Article LXII of the Amend-
10 ments to the Constitution of the Commonwealth, but the final
11 maturities of such notes, whether the original or renewal, shall not
12 be later than June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and ninety.

13 Notes and interest thereon issued under the authority of this
14 section, notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, shall be
15 general obligations of the commonwealth.

1 SECTION 4. To meet the expenditures necessary in carrying
2 out the provision of section one, the state treasurer shall, upon
3 request of the governor, issue and sell bonds of the commonwealth
4 to an amount to be specified by the governor from time to time, but
5 not exceeding in the aggregate three million five hundred thousand
6 dollars.

7 All bonds issued by the commonwealth, as aforesaid, shall be
8 designated on their face, "Metropolitan District Commission
9 Quarries Acquisition Loan, Act of 1987", and shall be issued for
10 such maximum term of years, not exceeding twenty years, as the
11 governor may recommend to the general court pursuant to Section
12 3 of Article LXII of the Amendments to the Constitution of the
13 Commonwealth, provided, however, that all such bonds shall be
14 payable not later than June thirtieth, two thousand and seven. All
15 interest and payments on account of principal of such obligations
16 shall be payable from the General Fund. Bonds and the interest
17 thereon issued under the authority of this section shall, notwith-
18 standing any other provisions of this act, be general obligations of
19 the commonwealth.
