AN ACT TO CLARIFY PAYROLL DEDUCTIONS OF EMPLOYEES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 17I of Chapter 180 is hereby amended by striking out  
2 Section 17I and inserting in place thereof the following: —  
3 Section 17I. Payroll Deductions of Educational Employees.  
4 Deductions on payroll schedules shall be made from the salary  
5 of any employee of any school committee, regional school district,  
6 educational collaborative, independent vocational school, or  
7 Board of Regents of higher education, in an amount or amounts  
8 which such employee may specify in writing to the school  
9 committee of the city, town, district, collaborative or school by  
10 which he is employed, or to the Board of Regents, as the case may  
11 be. Any such authorization may be withdrawn by such employee  
12 by giving at least sixty days' notice in writing of such withdrawal  
13 or withdrawals to said school committee or Board of Regents. The  
14 treasurer of the city, town, district, collaborative, or school, and  
15 the state treasurer in the case of employees of the Board of  
16 Regents, shall deduct from the salary of such employees such  
17 amount or amounts as may be certified to him on the payroll and  
18 shall transmit the sum so deducted to the designated state  
19 employee organization of which such employee is a member  
20 within thirty days; provided, that the city, town, district,  
21 collaborative or school treasurer or the state treasurer, in the case  
22 of employees of the Board of Regents, is satisfied by such evidence  
23 as he may require that the treasurer of such state employee  
24 organization has given a bond, in form approved by the

25 commissioner of corporations and taxation, for the faithful  
26 performance of his duties, in a sum and with such surety or sureties  
27 as are satisfactory to such city, town, district, collaborative, school  
28 or state treasurer.
