AN ACT REGULATING STATE CONTRACTS WITH COMPANIES DOING BUSINESS WITH SOUTH AFRICA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any special act or general law
2 to the contrary, all entities doing business with the common-
3 wealth, or who receive state funding, and who have business
4 interests in the Republic of South Africa, must be signators of
5 the statement of principals of United States firms with affiliates
6 in the Republic of South Africa commonly known as the Sullivan
7 Principles.

8 The executive office of manpower affairs shall oversee
9 compliance with this act.
