boarding kennel license providing any person, firm or corporation maintaining such pet shop, kennel and boarding kennel violates any of these regulations.

Any person, firm or corporation aggrieved by an order under this section may, by petition, appeal within thirty days to the superior court where said person resides, or where the firm or corporation is located. Such person shall, in substance, state the findings by the commissioner and the grounds of appeal and said court shall consider said proceedings de novo and the parties thereto shall have right of exception and appeal.

Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit the temporary importation of dogs for racing or field trials or the temporary importation of dogs or cats for show purposes, nor shall it prohibit the importation of dogs and cats as pets by individual owners.

Chap. 431. AN ACT ALLOWING A CREDIT UNION TO BE MEMBERS OF CERTAIN CORPORATE CENTRAL CREDIT UNIONS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The second paragraph of section 21 of chapter 171 of the General Laws, as most recently amended by chapter 38 of the acts of 1979, is hereby further amended by adding the following two paragraphs:-

(s) In the shares of any federally chartered corporate central credit union as defined in section thirty-six; provided, however, that not more than twenty-five per cent of the assets of a credit union shall be invested in such shares.

(t) In shares of the National Credit Union Administration Central Liquidity Facility; provided, however, that such investment shall not exceed the amount necessary to become a member of such facility.

SECTION 2. The third paragraph of said section 21 of said chapter 171, as most recently amended by chapter 309 of the acts of 1979, is hereby further amended by adding the following paragraph:-

(o) In the shares in a federally chartered corporate central credit union.

SECTION 3. Said chapter 171 is hereby further amended by adding the following section:-

Section 36. A credit union may, with the approval of the commissioner, become a regular member of the National Credit Union Administration Central Liquidity Facility, established by 12 USC 1795b.

A credit union may, with the approval of the commissioner become a member of any federally chartered corporate central credit union which has been approved to act as an agent of the National Credit Union Administration Central Liquidity Facility.

For the purposes of this section and section twenty-one, a corporate central credit union shall mean a federally chartered credit union primarily serving other credit unions. A credit union is primarily serving other credit unions when the total dollar amount of the shares and deposits received from other credit unions plus loans to other credit unions exceeds fifty per cent of the total dollar amount of all such shares, such deposits, and such loans.

Chap. 432. AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF HAMPDEN COUNTY.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. To provide for the maintenance of Hampden county, its departments, boards, commissions and institutions, of sundry other services, for certain permanent improvements, for interest and debt requirements, and to meet certain requirements of law, the following sums are hereby appropriated, subject to the provisions of law regulating the disbursement of county funds and the approval thereof, for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty-one.
