

HOUSE No. 2700

By Mr. DiMasi of Boston, petition of Salvatore F. DiMasi relative to the penalty for keeping and operating certain automatic amusement devices without a license. Criminal Justice.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE PENALTY FOR KEEPING AND OPERATING CERTAIN AUTOMATIC AMUSEMENT DEVICES WITHOUT A LICENSE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 178, as amended by chapter 693 of the acts of 1981,
3 and inserting in place thereof the following two sections: —

4 Section 178. Whoever without such license keeps or suffers to
5 be kept in a house, building, yard or dependency thereof, actually
6 occupied or owned by him, a table for the purpose of playing at
7 billiards, pool or sippio, or a bowling alley or an automatic
8 amusement device for hire, gain or reward, or whoever for hire,
9 gain or reward suffers any person to resort thereto for such
10 purpose shall forfeit not more than one thousand dollars.

11 Section 178A. The licensing authority of any city or town may
12 petition the superior court department of the trial court to enjoin
13 any violation of sections one hundred and seventy-seven, one
14 hundred and seventy-seven A or one hundred and seventy-eight.
