AN ACT FURTHER DEFINING APPLE CIDER PRODUCTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 128 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
- 2 after section 36C the following new section:
- 3 Section 36D. No person shall manufacture, label, package,
- 4 sell, keep for sale, expose or offer for sale in Massachusetts any
- 5 product designated as apple cider which does not consist entirely
- 6 of the unfermented, unpasteurized whole natural juice of fresh-
- 7 pressed apples.
