AN ACT RESTRICTING THE SALE OR DISTRIBUTION OF SNUB-NOSED HANDGUNS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 122 chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by inserting after the word gunsmith, in line 7, the following: —
3 except that no person shall be authorized under this section to sell,
4 rent, or lease handguns with a barrel three inches or less and easily
5 concealed in the palm of the hand or the coat pocket, unless the
6 person seeking to buy, rent, or lease said handgun with a barrel
7 three inches or less is a duly sworn, full time, active police officer in
8 the Commonwealth who must use said handgun in the performance
9 of his duties. No person shall be authorized under this section to sell
10 the component parts of said handgun with a barrel three inches or
11 less.
