By Mr. Morrissey of Quincy, petition of Michael W. Morrissey for payment from the state treasury of a sum of money to Francis L. Guerriero of the city of Quincy as reimbursement for state income taxes paid on exempt pension income. Ways and Means (House).

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF FRANCIS L. GUERRIERO.

1 *Resolved*, That notwithstanding the provisions of any general
2 or special law to the contrary and for the purpose of discharging
3 a moral obligation there shall be allowed and paid out of the state
4 treasury, subject to appropriation, to Francis L. Guerriero of
5 Quincy the sum of two thousand one hundred and five dollars
6 and forty-six cents in reimbursement of state income taxes paid
7 on exempt pension income.

It is the intention of the Legislature to amend the Constitution of the State of New York in relation to the powers of the Governor and the Council of State, and to provide for the election of the Governor and the Council of State by the people of the State.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK

ARTICLE IV. OF THE GOVERNMENT.

SECTION 1. OF THE GOVERNMENT.

Section 1. The executive power shall be vested in the Governor of the State. He shall hold office for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election to the same office for one term only. He shall be elected by the people of the State at a general election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of the year in which he is to take office.
