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AN ACT PERTAINING TO THE FIVE-DOLLAR SURCHARGE ON COURT FILING FEES IN SUMMARY PROCESS ACTION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 262, Section 4(c) of the General Laws is deleted.
