AN ACT PROHIBITING THE BLOCKING OR GRIDLOCK OF AN INTERSECTION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 89 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
- 2 after Section 8, the following section:
- 3 Section 8A. No operator of a motor vehicle shall proceed into an
- 4 intersection with a green signal light when such vehicle could not
- 5 successfully clear through the intersection without blocking, and
- 6 thereby causing a traffic gridlock with another direction then
- 7 having a green signal light. A violation of this section shall be
- 8 punished by a fine not less than twenty-five dollars.
