**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Seven.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN REIMBURSEMENT COSTS FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF SPECIAL NEEDS PUPILS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 13 of chapter 71B of the General Laws, as most recently  
2 amended by section 70I of chapter 367 of the Acts of 1978, is hereby  
3 further amended by striking said section 13 and inserting in place  
4 thereof the following: — The department shall reimburse a city or  
5 town in which a child resides who attends a clinical nursery school  
6 established under section twenty-seven of chapter nineteen or a  
7 child, who, because of insufficient classroom space in a clinical  
8 nursery school, attends a clinical nursery school, day care center or  
9 other institution for the care, education or treatment of retarded  
10 children conducted by an accredited school or college within the  
11 commonwealth, as provided in said section twenty-seven, or a  
12 retarded person who attends an educational, habilitational or day  
13 care program or facility of the department of mental health, as  
14 provided under section twenty-eight of said chapter nineteen, by  
15 paying the full cost of the transportation of each such child and  
16 adult to and from such educational, habilitational or day care  
17 program or facility, as the case may be, on each day said school is in  
18 session.

The Commission of Investigation

Section 1 of the Commission of Investigation Act, 1924

1. The Commission of Investigation shall consist of the following members:—
