AN ACT TO AMEND THE WORKERS' COMPENSATION ACT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 69 of Chapter 152 of the Massachusetts General Laws
2 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "division" the
3 following new language:

4 Public employees shall have the right to earn longevity, vacation
5 and other benefits while receiving Workers' Compensation
6 benefits, notwithstanding any law to the contrary. Further, public
7 employees shall not be precluded from negotiating through their
8 exclusive bargaining representatives an amount equal to the
9 difference between Workers' Compensation and their full salary.

of the House of Representatives of the United States of America in the 75th Congress, second session, on the 22d day of February, 1938, reported to the House the following bill, with amendments therein, for enactment into law:

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 8, Clause 18

to amend the Constitution of the United States

That the Constitution of the United States be amended so that the following clause shall be added to Article I, Section 8, Clause 18:

And that the words "and to punish counterfeiting of securities, and of bank notes" shall be amended to read "and to punish counterfeiting of securities, and of bank notes, and of the national debt."
