Giordano for legislation to authorize the establishment of a tourist information booth on interstate highway Route 93 in the city known as the town of Methuen; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 1625) of Paul V. Doane and Peter B. Morin for legislation relative to Cape and Islands Self-Reliance Corporation; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 276) of Mary Jeanette Murray for legislation to establish a displaced business assistance program; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1633) of Gloria L. Fox and other members of the House for legislation to establish a minority business development fund; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2484) of Kenneth M. Lemanski and Paul E. Caron for legislation to increase the availability of financial assistance and suitable facilities to industrial and commercial enterprises in the Commonwealth; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2485) of Kenneth M. Lemanski for legislation to create a task force in the western part of the Commonwealth for the purpose of initiating a pilot program involving service providers for disabled persons and area businesses; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3087) of Kenneth M. Lemanski, other members of the House and another for legislation to establish the office of small business utility advocate in the Department of Commerce and Development; the petition (accompanied by order, House, No. 3104) of Kenneth M. Lemanski and Peter B. Morin for an investigation and study by the committee on Commerce and Labor relative to small businesses and the regulations imposed upon such businesses; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3260) of Richard T. Moore and Mary Jeanette Murray for legislation to establish a displaced business assistance program; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4506) of Kenneth M. Lemanski, Paul E. Caron and Peter B. Morin for legislation to establish a bureau for business permits and licenses

in order to provide assistance to businesses wishing to operate in the Commonwealth; the petition (accompanied by order, House, No. 4510) of David P. Magnani, Kenneth M. Lemanski and Lois G. Pines for an investigation and study by the joint committee on Commerce and Labor relative to the extent to which state agencies are effective in providing capital to businesses in the Commonwealth; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5365) of Peter B. Morin relative to the Cape Cod Consumer Assistance Council, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5535) ought to be adopted.
