

By Mr. Voke of Chelsea, petition of Richard A. Voke and Francis D. Doris (with the approval of the mayor and board of aldermen) that the city of Chelsea be authorized to grant a certain pension to Leslie A. Haskell. Public Service. [Local Approval Received.]

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Seven.

AN ACT DIRECTING THE CITY OF CHELSEA TO GRANT A CERTAIN PENSION TO LESLIE A. HASKELL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or
2 special law to the contrary, and in order to promote the public
3 good, the Retirement Board of the City of Chelsea is hereby
4 authorized and directed to retire police officer Leslie A. Haskell,
5 of the police department of the City of Chelsea, who is totally
6 and permanently incapacitated for further service as a police
7 officer. The annual amount of pension payable to said Leslie A.
8 Haskell under this act shall be fixed in an amount equal to the
9 regular rate of benefits that he would have been paid had he been
10 retired for ordinary disability pursuant to Section Six of Chapter
11 32 of the General Laws. The annual pension payable by said city
12 to said Leslie A. Haskell under the provisions of this act shall be
13 reduced by the amount of any compensation he may receive from
14 any gainful employment after the effective date of his retirement.

15 Said Leslie A. Haskell shall be entitled to and shall receive all
16 annual cost-of-living adjustments, in his annual pension, granted
17 under the provisions of any general or special law. Said Leslie A.
18 Haskell shall also be entitled to and shall receive all other benefits,
19 such as medical insurance coverage, received by individuals now
20 retired under Section 6 of Chapter 32 of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. Benefits payable hereunder shall date from the
2 passage of this act and shall not be retroactive to any past date.
3 This act shall take effect upon passage.
