Silvia for legislation to abolish discrimination against women in prison forestry camps, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3302) of Richard T. Moore and Mary Jeanette Murray for legislation to abolish discrimination against women in prison forestry camps, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3714) of Byron Rushing and other members of the House for legislation to abolish discrimination against women in prison forestry camps, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4248) of Charles F. Flaherty for legislation to abolish discrimination against women in prison forestry camps, reports recommending that the accompanying bill (House, No. 5666) ought to pass.

## AN ACT RELATIVE TO PRISON REFORESTATION CAMPS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 48A of Chapter 127 of the General Laws,  
2 as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended by  
3 striking in line 5, the words "or in the prison camps".

1 SECTION 2. Sections eighty-three, eighty-three A, eighty-  
2 three B, eighty-three C, eighty-three D, eighty-three E, and one  
3 hundred and ninety-two C of Chapter one hundred and twenty-  
4 seven of the General Laws are hereby repealed.
