AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WAKEFIELD TO APPROPRIATE MONEY FOR THE REMOVAL OF SNOW AND ICE ON WAYS OR ROADS NOT OPEN TO PUBLIC USE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 6C and 6D of  
2 Chapter 40 of the Massachusetts General Laws, the Town of  
3 Wakefield is hereby authorized to appropriate money for the  
4 removal of snow and ice on such ways or roads as may be  
5 designated by the Board of Public Works of the Town,  
6 notwithstanding the fact that such way or road is not open to the  
7 public use.

Resolved, That the sum of \$100,000 be appropriated for the purchase of land for the establishment of a national observatory at the site of the old Fort Mifflin, in the city of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Approved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, this 15th day of March, 1873.
