The committee on Government Regulations, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 304) of Mary Jeanette Murray for legislation to prohibit the use of coin operated machines by the State Lottery Commission, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 308) of Chester A. Suhoski for legislation to establish a Massachusetts evergreen lottery council, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 510) of Thomas M. Finneran and Thomas G. Palumbo that cities and towns be authorized to conduct public safety lotteries, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 738) of Walter A. DeFilippi, Mary Jane McKenna and Robert J. Rohan relative to the distribution of monies collected from the Megabucks lottery, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4691) of Frank Maragioglio for legislation to further regulate the payment of prize money to persons holding winning tickets in the State Lottery, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5739) ought to be adopted.

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1     *Ordered*, That the committee on Government Regulations be  
2 authorized during the recess of the General Court to make an  
3 investigation and study of House documents numbered; 304, 308,  
4 510, 738 and 4691 relative to the Lottery.  
5     Said committee shall report to the General Court the results  
6 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,  
7 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
8 recommendations into effect, by filing with the Clerk of the House  
9 of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday in December,  
10 nineteen hundred and eighty-seven.
