AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE OFFICE FOR CHILDREN LICENSING SANCTIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Paragraph (c) of section 10 of chapter 28A of the  
2 General Laws, as appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby  
3 amended by striking out clause (9) and inserting in place thereof  
4 the following two clauses: — (9) organization, financing and  
5 administration; and (10) fines and other sanctions.

1 SECTION 2. Section 13 of said chapter 28A, as so appearing,  
2 is hereby amended by striking out the first sentence and insert-  
3 ing in place thereof the following sentence: — Subject to the  
4 requirements of chapter thirty A the office may suspend, revoke,  
5 make probationary, refuse to renew the license or approval of any  
6 person, assess a fine, or impose any sanctions it deems  
7 appropriate.

1 SECTION 3. Said section 13 of said chapter 28A, as so appear-  
2 ing, is hereby further amended by adding the following para-  
3 graph: —

4 The office for children shall submit an annual report to the joint  
5 committee on human services and elderly affairs which shall  
6 include rules and regulations promulgated by said office for chil-  
7 dren relative to the use of fines and sanctions, the levels of fines  
8 and types of sanctions.
