The committee on Commerce and Labor, to whom was referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 55) of Edward L. Burke, Salvatore R. Albano, Royal L. Bolling, Sr., Frederick E. Berry, Michael J. Barrett and John W. Olver for legislation relative to the testing of employees for drug or alcohol use, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1478) of the Mass. AFL-CIO State Labor Council and David B. Cohen relative to limiting lie detector tests by certain employers, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2477) of David B. Cohen and other members of the House for legislation to limit the testing of certain employees for drugs and alcohol, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3080) of Kenneth M. Lemanski, Michael J. Rea, Jr., Peter B. Morin, Walter A. DeFilippi, Denis Lawrence and another relative to the use of certain tests by employers, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5194) of Frank J. McGee for legislation to prohibit the use of urinalysis testing by employers, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5770) ought to be adopted.

1 *Ordered*, That the committee on Commerce and Labor be
2 authorized to sit during recess of the General Court to make an
3 investigation and study of Senate document numbered 55 and
4 House documents numbered 1478, 2477, 3080 and 5194 relative
5 to the testing of employees.

6 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
7 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
8 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
9 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk
10 of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednes-
11 day in December, nineteen hundred and eighty-seven.
