By Mr. Decas of Wareham, petition of Charles N. Decas (by vote of the town) that the town of Wareham be authorized to raise a certain sum of money for the purpose of paying salaries due to certain employees of the public schools of said town. Local Affairs. [Local Approval Received.]

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WAREHAM TO RAISE A SUM OF MONEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING SALARIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the
2 contrary the town of Wareham is hereby authorized to raise and
3 appropriate the sum of \$12,634.51 for the purpose of paying
4 salaries due in fiscal year 1985 to the following employees of the

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to
2 the contrary, the town of Wareham is hereby authorized to raise
3 and appropriate the sum of \$4,776.38 for the purpose of paying
4 salaries due in fiscal year 1986 to the following employees of the
5 Wareham public schools: Linda Boucher \$1,012.27; Elaine Butler
6 \$1,472.31; Joan Holway \$761.97; Jacqueline Schulze \$338.80;
7 Doris Westgate \$1,009.96; Joanne DeGregorio \$181.00.

The Mr. House of Representatives passed on August 1, 1901, a bill to amend the act of August 1, 1890, entitled "An act to provide for the purchase of certain lands for the purpose of the establishment of a national park in the State of Colorado." (Sess. Laws, 1901, p. 100.)

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 8, Clause 18

It is the duty of the President to see that the laws are faithfully executed.

The President is the Commander in Chief of the Army and Navy, and holds the office during the term of years for which he is elected.

Section 1. The executive power shall be vested in the President of the United States. He shall hold his office during the term of years for which he is elected, and shall be eligible for re-election once only. He shall, in addition to the powers and duties vested in him by this Constitution, have the honor and respect due to the office of President of the United States.

Section 2. The President shall be Commander in Chief of the Army and Navy of the United States, and of the Militia of the several States, when called into the actual service of the United States; he may grant reprieves and pardons for offenses against the United States, except in cases of impeachment; he shall have the power to fill up all vacancies which may happen during the recess of the Senate, by granting commissions which shall expire at the end of their respective terms.
