**AN ACT EXTENDING ELIGIBILITY TO PROVIDE ALOCHOL REHABILITATION
TREATMENT PROGRAMS FOR SECOND OFFENDER DRUNK DRIVERS TO
PRIVATE VENDORS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The first sentence of subparagraph (4) of para-
2 graph (a) of subdivision (1) of section 24 of chapter 90 is hereby
3 amended by adding at the end thereof after the word "program" the
4 following: — or be confined for a period of no less than twenty-one
5 days in a resident alcohol treatment program, privately owned or
6 operated within or without the commonwealth, so long as such
7 program is comparable to those sanctioned by the division and the
8 expense of such program is borne by the defendant.

1 SECTION 2. The first paragraph of subparagraph (4) of para-
2 graph (a of subdivision (1) of section 24 of chapter 90 is hereby
3 amended by adding the end thereof the following paragraph: —
4 A judge may determine that a defendant's twenty-one day con-
5 finement in a privately owned or operated alcohol treatment center
6 prior to the effective date of this act, will satisfy the conditions of
7 probation.
