RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THE COMMONWEALTH AND THE HIGH SCHOOL DROP-OUT RATE.

1     *Resolved*, That a special commission to consist of three  
2 senators, five members of the house of representatives, and three  
3 persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby established  
4 for the purpose of making an investigation and study relative to  
5 secondary schools in the commonwealth and the high school drop-  
6 out rate.

7     Said commission may involve in advisory roles such persons,  
8 organizations, or public and private institutions as it may  
9 determine appropriate.
