AN ACT RELATIVE TO INCREASING THE AVAILABILITY OF BURIAL PERMITS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 45 of Chapter 114 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the 1984 Official Edition, is hereby amended by strik-
3 ing out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof the following
4 sentence: — Except as provided in section forty-four and forty-six,
5 no undertaker or other person shall bury or otherwise dispose of a
6 human body in a town, or remove therefrom a human body which
7 has not been buried, until he has received a permit from the board
8 of health or its agent appointed to issue such permits, or if there is
9 no such board, from the clerk of the town where the person died or
10 the town where the undertaker's or other person's place of business
11 is located; provided, however, that such clerk, board of health or
12 such agent shall make such permits available at any time, including
13 weekends and holidays, on a twenty-four hour per day basis; pro-
14 vided further, that such clerk, board of health or such agent shall
15 transmit the original death certificate to the clerk in the city or town
16 where such person died within one business day; and, provided
17 further, that no undertaker or other person shall exhume a human
18 body and remove it from a town or from one cemetery to another,
19 until he has received a permit from the board of health or its agent
20 aforesaid or from the clerk of the town where such body is buried.

1 SECTION 2. Within one year of the effective date of this act,
2 the commissioner of the department of public health shall study
3 and evaluate the availability of burial permits to undertakers.
