**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE POWERS OF THE BUREAU OF SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 7 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking  
2 out section 30Q and inserting in place thereof the following  
3 section: —

4 Section 30Q. Establishment; members; human services  
5 programs; investigation of fraud; rules and regulations.

6 There shall be a fraudulent claims commission in the executive  
7 office for administration and finance, hereinafter called the  
8 commission, which shall establish rules and regulations for the  
9 investigation of fraud under any program administered by any  
10 agency within the executive office of human services. The  
11 commission shall consist of the commissioner of administration,  
12 or his designee, the secretary of human services, or his designee,  
13 and the attorney general, or his designee. The commissioner of  
14 administration, or his designee, shall be the chairman of the  
15 commission.
